New Vaccination Protocol - IMPORTANT READING

As suggested by Dr. Dodd for years, the revised Vaccination Protocol for ALL 27 Vet hospitals will apparently be changing their programs.

This is welcome news and should be taken with you to your vet should you need reinforcement against over-vaccination.

VACCINATION NEWSFLASH [CIMDA support]

Re: J Dodd's vaccine protocol

I would like to make you aware that all 27 veterinary schools in North America are in the process of changing their protocols for vaccinating dogs and cats.

Some of this information will present an ethical & economic challenge to vets, and there will be skeptics. Some organizations have come up with a political compromise suggesting vaccinations every 3 years to appease those who fear loss of income vs. those concerned about potential side effects. Politics, traditions, or the doctor's economic well-being should not be a factor in medical decision.

NEW PRINCIPLES OF IMMUNOLOGY:

Dogs and cats immune systems mature fully at 6 months. If a modified live virus vaccine is given after 6 months of age, it produces immunity, which is **good for the life of the pet** (ie: canine distemper, parvo, feline distemper). If another MLV vaccine is given a year later, the antibodies from the first vaccine neutralize the antigens of the second vaccine and there is little or no effect. The titer is not "boosted" nor are more memory cells induced.

Not only are annual boosters for parvo and distemper unnecessary, they subject the pet to potential risks of allergic reactions and immune-mediated haemolytic anaemia. There is no scientific documentation to back up label claims for annual administration of MLV vaccines.

Puppies receive antibodies through their mothers milk. This natural protection can last 8-14 weeks. Puppies & kittens should NOT be Vaccinated at LESS than 8 weeks. Maternal immunity will neutralize the vaccine and little protection (0-38%) will be produced.

Vaccination at 6 weeks will, however, DELAY the timing of the first highly effective vaccine.

Vaccinations given 2 weeks apart SUPPRESS rather than stimulate the immune system.

A series of vaccinations is given starting at 8 weeks and given 3-4 weeks apart up to 16 weeks of age. Another vaccination given sometime after 6 months of age (usually at 1 year 4 mo) will provide lifetime immunity.

Inside Story Headline

For many decades, there have been occasional reports of apricot/brindle SP pups. The genetic basis for this coat color phenotype has been the subject of a fair amount of debate, but it appears that debate is now resolved. The allele that causes brindle in SPs has now been identified and may be tested for. This should be of particular interest to apricot/red breeders. Snips & Snails & Puppy Dog Tails



It's time to bring out those "oh so tempting" decorations.

Anything on the Christmas tree from nose level down is fair game. Decorate the bottom 1/3 of the tree with non-breakables. If you put poodle goodies on the tree you're asking for trouble. Heirloom ornaments may be best placed on a small tree on top of the entertainment center.

If you use any type of tree preservative, cover the water supply so the Poodles can't drink it.

At least one poodle will lie under the tree; make sure it's level and steady, or secured to something like a wall or the ceiling.

One year, in a small house, with a herd of Shelties, I finally put the Christmas tree inside the X-Pen. I got tired of them knocking it over as they did "zoomies round the tree"

Roasts, tenderloin, etc may be wrapped with string, and that string will smell GREAT! Wrap well and dispose carefully. String is just like ribbon, tinsel and yarn for causing bowel obstructions.

If a dog eats a glass ornament, feed cotton ball pieces smeared with butter or margarine. The cotton will (hopefully) collect and coat the pieces of glass. It must be real cotton, not synthetic. White bread can also be used. This is just for immediate emergency use, you still need a vet!

Chocolate, alcohol, raisins, holly, mistletoe and lilies are toxic to pets.

Do not allow puppies to go home as Christmas Day presents, it's not fair to the puppy. Have the parents get pictures, bowl, collar, leash, toys, etc and make arrangements for December 27.

In her crate is the safest place for a Poodle during parties and while lots of people are going in and out. She also doesn't need the rumaki or crab dip.

Make sure everybody is microchipped and wearing collars with tags,

Sugar Free gum (or anything containing Xylitol) is toxic and guest purses on the floor are very attractive to inquisitive noses.

Protect your chewers by covering electrical cords with a cord cover, not a rug.

Be careful where you place candles.

Treats and items from China are still on the danger list, read the labels.

AKC REPORTS

At the AKC Delegate meeting the Delegate body approved the change to Chapter 3 Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows to allow the Amateur Owner Handler Class. The vote to eliminate the Novice Class failed so shows can offer both these classes. It is at the discretion of the show giving Club which classes they will offer only the American and Open classes are mandatory.

Section 6:

The Amateur-Owner-Handler class shall be for dogs that are at least six months of age that are not champions. Dogs must be handled in the class by the registered owner of the dog. This class is restricted to exhibitors who have not, at any point in time, been a professional dog handler, AKC approved conformation judge, or employed as an assistant to a professional handler. Additionally, members of the immediate family or household of a current professional handler are ineligible for this class (as defined in Chapter 11, Section 13).

USEFULL HINTS

Making Your Own Ice Packs:

Pour 3/4 cup water and 1/4 cup rubbing alcohol into a zippered storage bag and close. Put the bag into another bag, seal, and freeze. Because the alcohol doesn't freeze, you will end up with a nice flexible, slushy ice pack. (Be sure to label the contents clearly so that no one will try to use it for anything edible.)

Double or triple this recipe as needed to make the correct size to fit the area needing the ice. Works Great!

Motion Sickness Drug

New drug for dogs with motion sickness.

Maropitant (Cerenia) has been approved for treating dogs that get sick riding in cars. The medication can be prescribed by your veterinarian

Vomiting

Boil cabbage for about 15 - 20 minutes and let cool. It can quickly help to settle the stomach. Give at two 2 CC's (one teaspoon equals 5 CC's) per 10 pounds of body weight as needed.

Diarrhea

The primary cause for diarrhea is over eating. Use plain canned pumpkin to help firm stools. Give dogs weighing up to 30 pound 1/2 teaspoon, dogs 30 - 60 pounds one teaspoon and dogs over this weight about two teaspoons to a tablespoon
