Rules:

"(Professional) Handlers may show their own dogs." (Professional means those who regularly show someone else dogs for a fee). Dogs entered in, Bred By Exhibitor class, must be handled by the breeder of record. (That means if you bred the dog and owned it at the time it was bred you are the breeder of record. If you later sold it or co-owned it they may not show that dog in BBE class)

The classes will be puppy 3-6; 6-9; 9-12 Bred by Exhibitor; 12-18 mo and open. The puppy classes will be judged best in puppy classes from the winners of the 3-6; 6-9; 9-12 classes. The adult class for winners will be first in the BBE class, 12-18 class and open classes. There is only one BBE class not a BBE puppy and BBE open. So list the classes as Dogs and bitches in each variety 3-6; 6-9; 9-12, 12-18, Bred by Exhibitor, and Open.

Best in Puppy classes and best in Adult Classes Dogs and Bitches in each variety. Best of Puppy in each Variety will compete for best puppy. Best Adult in each Variety will compete for best adult. The final will be Best in Match.

Snips & Snails & Puppy Dog Tails

Spring Reminders:

Refill your supply of Heartworm medicine and your chosen flea and tick preventative. Protect your dog's emotional health by avoiding large, noisy events such as rock concerts or fireworks displays.

It is extremely dangerous to drive a truck with a dog in the back. In fact, in many states it is illegal. Dogs can be injured from flying debris and can also be thrown from the pick-up bed during the ride. Dogs should always ride in the cab, preferably confined in a crate or by using a seat belt safety harness.

Long Trips By Car A seat upholstery protector, or waterproof seat cover will make clean-ups easier in case your pet does get sick or has an accident. And be sure to take along a few cleaning supplies to avoid having to search out a place to purchase them at the last minute.

Safely secure your pet while traveling. An unrestrained pet can become a deadly projectile in the event of a sudden stop or crash, causing serious injury (even death) to itself, you or your passengers. For example, an unsecured, 25-pound dog in a 40 mph crash becomes a 1,000-pound mass (half a ton) flying uncontrollably inside the vehicle. The safest place for your poodle is in her crate.

Never attach a restraining device to a pet's collar. Do not allow your pet to ride with its head outside of the window. An obstacle close to the vehicle could potentially strike your pet's head, causing injury or death, or dirt particles could get into your pet's ears, nose, eyes, or throat, causing health problems.

It's a good idea to stop every couple of hours for your pet and you to stretch and walk around. Never let your poodle out of the car before attaching a leash. Pets in unfamiliar surroundings may either become scared and run away or curious and go exploring.

Have your own supply of water or use bottled to avoid "travel tummy".

Leaving a pet in a parked car is never a good idea. Temperatures in confined spaces in the spring and summer can heat up fast, causing heatstroke or death.

A pet first-aid kit is an essential item to pack when venturing out and should contain things such as antiseptic cream, assorted bandages, tweezers, eye drops, gauge, tape, and the like. Know what items are in your kit and how to use them.

Your pet's medical records, medications and health certificate should also be packed. Phone numbers for your pet's vet, the National Animal Poison Control Center hotline (888-426-4435), and emergency pet hospitals in the areas where you plan to travel should be taken along.

A travel tag on a pet's collar will help someone locate you should you and your pet become separated. The travel tag should contain information about where you are staying locally (while away from home), including addresses and phone numbers. A cell phone number is also a good idea since most people have one with them, especially when they travel.

Take along a recent photo of your pet. In case you become separated, it will help others better identify the pet they're looking for.

Be considerate and practice good "petiquette" by cleaning up after your pet. Always keep a supply of pick-up bags with you.

Rules Applying to Dog Shows

Any person acting in the capacity of Match Secretary at a match, or any member of his immediate household or immediate family (as defined in Chapter 11, Sections 12 & 13 of the *Rules Applying to Dog Shows*), shall not exhibit, act as agent or handler at the match, and dogs owned wholly or in part by him or by any member of his immediate household or immediate family shall be ineligible to be entered at that match.

No judge or any person residing in the same household with a judge shall exhibit or act as agent or handler at a match at which he is officiating as judge and dogs owned wholly or in part by such judge or any member of his household shall be ineligible to be entered at such match. Subject to the foregoing, members of a judge's immediate family who no longer reside in the same household may enter or handle a dog at a match if the judge is not officiating over any competition, including a group class or best in match, for which the dog is entered or may become eligible.

RISKS LINKED TO EARLY NEUTERERING

A subject often debated, and often recommended by veterinarians, is reported in DOG WORLD , April issue 2008: The result of a recent study at Colorado State University suggests that early neutering (prior to 6 months of age) may be a risk factor for developing excessive tibial plateau angle (TPA) in large-breed dogs with cranial cruciate ligament disease a common cause of lameness in dogs.

CAN YOU OVERVACCINATE ?

In the same April issue of Dog World, W. Jean Dodds, DVM, considers the factors that INCREASE RISK of adverse events 3 days after vaccination: * young adult age *small-breed size *neutering *multiple vaccines given per visit. The question is asked; CAN YOU OVERVACCINATE ? Followed by proper vaccination protocol. A MUST read. See page 18 of DOG WORLD, April 2008 issue.

DOGS WITH BAD BAD BREATH

Many dogs, especially those who eat moist food, have breath that could knock the Statue of Liberty off her perch. Dogs smell of the food they eat; and if they eat manure or fish they'll smell like it. So one solution is to change their diet, especially to dry kibbles.

Commonly, though, the source of room-clearing bad breath in dogs is bad teeth and gum problems. So have their teeth cleaned annually by the vet; brush them yourself regularly (sure); or try one of the many products sold to improve dogs' breath.

To get your dog to eat that dry boring stuff, try mixing a small amount of tasty moist food in with it, micro waving the kibbles for a few seconds, or both.
