Need Help Finding the Right Guy?

Wondering why you always pick the wrong guy for romance?

Woof!

That's the sound of your new dating adviser. Yes, the ultimate guide to love is drooling and asleep at your feet. The traits that women adore or hate in their dogs offer them strong clues about what they need in a mate.

At least, that's the theory of long-time dog trainer and writer Sarah Wilson, who has coauthored seven books about dogs and has a master's degree in the human-animal bond. We talked to Wilson, 45, from Gardiner, N.Y., about how women's four-legged companions can help them find better two-legged ones.

Q. Why do women bond so strongly with their dogs?

A. Women like a lot of social contact, doing things together and shared emotions. Dogs fill this bill amazingly well. And when you get into non-verbal signals -- being close to you, looking up into your eyes -- dogs do that in a way that other companion animals just don't.

Q. How can our dog clue us in to what we should seek in a mate?

A. What we need to feel loved, fulfilled is going to be similar in our dogs, our friends, our significant others. For women who like sporting breeds -- golden retrievers, labs -- they want someone loving and social who will adore them. For women who like working breeds -- Dobermans, Rottweilers, boxers -- they want someone more serious. They want to feel safe.

Q. What if a woman adores her Siberian husky?

A. She's probably looking for an independent, outdoorsy type man, handsome and rugged, who is fun to do stuff with but isn't going to sit home pining for her.

Q. And a toy poodle?

A. It doesn't mean you want someone short. The toy breeds probably don't reflect what you are looking for in a man but fulfill a desire for caring and intimacy you want with a child.

Q. Can what bugs you about your dog also warn you about what you don't want in a guy?

A. Yes! I was married to a very nice man who spent way too much time waiting on my every word. He was

always home, very attentive; most women would love it. I felt smothered. I could never own a border collie. All they do is sit and stare at you all day saying, "What are you doing? What are you doing?" It would drive me insane. I got divorced.

Now I'm happily married to a man I have to flag down to get his attention; perfect for me. I have a terrier mix named PJ. If I want to go do something, she's ready to do it. But the rest of the time she has her own life.

Q. So, how do you use this information when you're meeting guys in a bar?

A. The part of [your dog] you find irritating, don't replicate that in your human partner. Say the golden retriever wants to be physically touching you every second of the day and following you around the house. If a woman finds this annoying, don't choose the guy who calls you back 15 times. If you don't find this annoying, do choose the guy who calls you back because you want that closeness.
