**Newbie PCA Info**

For people and toy poodles only you can fly into Baltimore (BWI) and then take a puddle jumper into the Salisbury (SBY) airport. These planes do not have the space or cargo facilities to take Standards or minis! I don't know if there is car rental there.

The most commonly chosen alternative is to fly into Baltimore and rent a car and drive to Salisbury. NOTE: The taxes at BWI are incredible, it was over \$60 in 2003. If you book your car online (recommended) be aware that the taxes will not be

mentioned and it will cost you another \$100 (tax and gas) for your car. Making the reservation now will save you about 50%!!! you can always cancel a car reservation with no penalty.

hospital (convenient-but I know of nobody who needed it last year). If a bellboy (I hate that word) helps you on arrival tip him well! We get amazing service that way. Same for the housekeeper and learn and USE their names! When you leave your room for the day (when cleaning is expected) do your best to make it look, as if no dogs have been there. (extra leashes, toys and food dishes in the dresser drawers) You're not hiding the dogs, just making it easy for the staff. Used towels in 1 pile under the sink or in the tub. Trash in the cans, like you would do it at home.

The Ramada also shares a lot line with the local newspaper. Important info if your baby makes the front page!

Dunkin Donuts is about 1 mile south of the hotel on the same side as the Ramada on Salisbury

Bldv. Most of the fast food places are about 1.5 miles north of the hotel on Salisbury Blvd (also known as Rt 13) with the Hampton Inn, the gas stations and the Golden Corral Restaurant. Walmart is approx 3 miles south of the hotel on Fruitland Blvd in Fruitland, MD and shares their parking lot with the most wonderful steakhouse you can imagine!

If you're renting a car, go into Mapquest or Yahoo Driving Directions and print yourself maps from the airport to your hotel and back; your hotel to the Ramada; from your hotel to the Civic Center; from your hotel to the Hunt Test or WC/WCX; and take the maps with you!

Plan on attending the Royal Canin Welcome party in the Ramada (free munchies and everybody is there.)

We have never found a "bad side of town" and most peo-

ple were very nice, but be sensible, lock your car and don't leave your cell phone laying on the seat.

There is a quaint bridge from the back side of the Ramada over the river and to the restaurants on the next street over. It is NOT well lighted, is uneven and treacherous.....hold the rail and watch your step. BTW the restaurant on the other side was your typical overpriced, ala carte, froo froo, delusions of France, yuppie place, and not recommended, however the waiters are all young, male and cute.

## Story's Story - By Barbara Burdick

It started 5 1/2 weeks ago when I found a wonderful home for my 4 year old Barclay Lyca Just So Stories. The people were at my home a few times and I made friends with them. They also have a toy dog they rescued 9 years ago. After they had Story for a week the dad and son took her for a walk on March 5th. For whatever reason, she got away from them and started to run. It only took a few minutes and she was gone. They live in a lake area in Marlton, NJ about 2 hours away from me. I got there as soon as I got the call that she had ran off and the search started, it lasted for almost 6 weeks. I had been there 19 times looking, walking, driving, knocking on doors, giving out flyers, hanging flyers, going to the Shelters, vets and local groomers. The area is acres and acres of woods called Marlton Lakes. People kept seeing her in one area then another; we left food, water and crates in several areas. We had friends and strangers looking for her. People I don't even know. I have to say the people of Marlton,

NJ are the most caring people for pets of all kinds. They leave food and water out for anything that needs or wants it, one lady leaves a heating pad in a bed for a wild cat so it won't get cold. People took their kids every day in the woods to look for Story, they had dirt bikes and drove through the thicket and bramble.

On the evening of April 6th, 2 men who were local farmers and hunters called the fellow who had Story and told him to meet them on this dirt road that just kept going and going, they showed him footprints of a dog with a lead dragging (yes, she had her lead on the whole time). He told Anthony he would put a trap up and catch her. He put some kind of chicken with gravy on it inside and then made a trail to the woods with it.

I had a very bad night thinking about Story and could not sleep, felt something funny inside. About 10am the next day, Anthony called and started yelling they got her, they got her. Anthony said that after all the people who tried to get her and she keep running away,

these guys were the ones to catch her. I got down there as fast as I could, told them not to open the trap until I got there. When I arrived, she was just lying there like dead, I called her name and she jumped up and could not wait until I got her out to jump on me and kiss me. I didn't think she would know me but how can they forget the hand that feeds them?

I have Story home now and she is happily playing with her daughter Rikki Tikki Tavi. As you can see from the before and after pictures of Story, she is not gray, she is cream. It took me over 3 hours to pick all the ticks off. I stopped counting after 200 on her and 2 on me. I can go on and on about the last 5 1/2 weeks but then it would be a book, but I really would like to thank the hundreds of people who cared and helped and got our dog back home for us, they will be in my prayers forever. What a wonderful community. We would like to visit again and let them all meet the wonderful dog that they all worked so hard to find.
